CINNAMON CREAM CHEESE ROLLUPS

INGREDIENTS

YIELD 16 roll

- 1 Loaf thin sliced white bread, crusts removed
- 8 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 egg yolk
- 3/4 cup powdered sugar
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 3/4 cup melted butter

DIRECTIONS

1. Remove crusts and flatten bread with a rolling pin.
2. Mix cream cheese, egg yolk, and powdered sugar.
3. Combine sugar and cinnamon; set aside.
4. Spread 1 Tbsp cheese mixture on each slice of bread.
5. Roll up.
6. Dip in melted butter, then in cinnamon sugar.
7. Place on ungreased baking sheet.
8. Bake at 350°F for 20 minutes, or until golden.

NOTE: Because I forget the cream cheese, even after going to the market, I improvised by using peanut butter, peanut butter and jelly, ham and cheese and cheese and tomatoes.
